


DFGs by Age Group





### How to use this scorecard

[1] This is your council's DFG allocation from the Government compared to other local authorities in England. It's a simple ranking based on the amount of funding each council received—1st means the highest allocation. This helps you see how your funding compares nationally.

[2] Any numbers in round brackets show how things changed from last year:

- (+1) means the number went up by 1.
- (−2) means it went down by 2.
- (=) means no change.
- If there's no value, your council didn't report data for that item last year.


[3] The average DFG value isn't part of the Delta survey. We've worked it out by dividing your council's total spend on home adaptations by the number of completed grants you reported. If your council did not provide the total spend on home adaptations, we have used DFG allocation instead.

[4] The ranking shows how your council compares to others that gave full delivery data for Stages 2, 3, and 4. A lower ranking means quicker delivery times (1st is the fastest). A higher ranking means your times are longer than most other councils.

Not all councils gave data for every stage of delivery. That's why the totals are different for each stage:

- 281 gave data for Stage 2.
- 280 for Stage 3.
- 290 for Stage 4.

[5]<sup>[a]</sup> The small chart shows how delivery times vary across all councils. The x-axis shows delivery time (0 to 600 working days), and the y-axis shows how many councils fall into each range. The vertical claret line marks your council—the further left it is, the quicker your delivery times.



[6] The mean working days figure for England and your region isn't just the average of each council's results. Instead, we work it out like this:

- Multiply each council's average delivery time by the number of DFGs they completed.
- Add up all those figures.
- Divide by the total number of completed DFGs across the country.

This way, councils that complete more grants have a bigger influence on the national average than those that do only a few.

[a] If your council did not provide complete data, or reported average total delivery times over 600 working days, note [5] will not apply.
