Reasons	West Oxfordshire District Council, in accordance with regulation 4(3)(b)(iv)(bb) of the Neighbourhood Planning (Referendums) Regulations 2012 confirmed in a statement (Chief Executive - dated 4 April 2023) that the District Council was satisfied that the draft Milton-under-Wychwood Neighbourhood Plan meets the basic conditions required. This statement followed suitable modifications to the Plan made in response to modifications recommended in the external independent examination of the Neighbourhood Plan (Independent Examiner's Report – dated 2 February 2023).				
	The Neighbourhood Plan was cleared for referendum which was held on 22 June 2023. More than 50% of those who voted were in favour of the Plan being used to help decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area (see Declaration of Result of Poll – 22 June 2023). Paragraph 38A (4)(a) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 as amended requires that the District Council must make the neighbourhood Plan if more than half of those voting have voted in favour of the plan.				
	The referendum held on 22 June 2023 met the requirements of the Localism Act 2011. The referendum posed the question: "Do you want West Oxfordshire District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Milton-under-Wychwood to help decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?" The results of the referendum were:

	Note: turnout: 18.32%  The Basic Conditions Statement notes that the Plan has had regard to the fundamental rights and freedoms under the European Convention on Human Rights and complies with the Human Rights Act. Indeed the Independent Examiner concluded that there is nothing in the Plan that would lead to a conclusion that there has been any breach. In accordance with this conclusion, the District Council's assessment of the plan, including its preparation, concluded that it does not breach nor is incompatible with the relevant legislation.  The Decision Statement confirms that Milton-under-Wychwood Neighbourhood Plan can now be made.
